Word from the Pastor



Advent reminds us of the generosity of God. As I reflect on the Gospels as well as Pauline epistles, I am moved to note this undergirding truth forcefully spilling over all through the New Testament – What we don't deserve, He freely gives.

St.John in his prologue in John 1:1-18 says: 'And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.' (v.14).

Advent forcefully communicates the generosity of God in Christ Jesus. From the generous bounty of the Father, it's as John the beloved beautifully records for us in John 1:16: 'And from his fullness we have all received grace upon grace.' It's literally raining grace upon us, blessing upon blessing, favour upon favour. God's shower is open, gift after gift. The Apostle Paul in Romans 5:20 says: 'Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more.' As Paul further shares his testimony with Timothy, he states in I Tim.1:14: 'And the grace of our Lord overflowed for me.' In other words, Paul is visualising and underscoring this truth clearly by stating: God's tap was not closed when it came to his soul and spirit.

Santa Forgot you??? Not to Worry..... Jesus Didn't

We're all looking forward to having a time of fun and quality time with our families and friends aren't we? I guess that we're eagerly anticipating gifts too. Yes of course.. I guess all of us are excited about these things (including me.) May I also mention that children would also be on their best behavior and eagerly awaiting gifts from Santa Claus. But all our celebrations would be in vain if we forgot the primary focus of the season. Yes, it is indeed the commemoration of the virgin birth of the LORD JESUS CHRIST, the focal point in history where Almighty God assumed the likeness of frail man for the salvation of humanity. Someone once said "*The most beautiful thing about Christmas shines in the first six letters of the word*". Jim Reeves beautifully brings out the meaning of Christmas in a song he wrote entitled "C-H-R-I-S-T-M-A-S", the lyrics of which are as follows:

- "C" is for the Christ Child born upon this day;
- "H" for herald angels in the night.
- "<u>R" means our Redeemer;</u>
- "I" means Israel;
- "S" is for the star that shone so bright.
- "T" is for the three wise men, They who travelled far.
- "M" is for the manger where He lay.
- "A" 's for all He stands for;
- "S" means shepherds came,
- And that's why there's a Christmas Day.

Charles Wesley composed the popular hymn "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" wherein he hailed the baby "BORN THAT MAN MAY NO MORE DIE".

John Francis Wade, in a Latin Hymn he composed entitled "Adeste Fidelis" better known as its English version entitled "O Come All Ye Faithful" perceived the baby as "<u>WORD of the FATHER now in flesh</u> <u>appearing</u>"

Isaac Watts in his well known composition entitled "Joy To the World" heralds the coming of the Messiah. In fact many believe that he was not just referring to the birth of Christ in this World but his composition is also the expression of a believer's expectation of Christ's second coming to judge and rule the world with perfect justice, righteousness, and peace for all eternity. The last paragraph of the hymn illustrated just that:

He rules the world with truth and grace, And makes the nations prove The glories of His righteousness, And wonders of His love,(x2) And wonders, wonders, of His love

The above hymns commemorate the very fact that God, the Everlasting Father of all creation who always existed and will continue to exist from everlasting to everlasting sent His only begotten Son into a world perishing in sin and rebellion. God [The Son] took on the likeness of frail human flesh and dwelt among us. God did not send His Son to condemn the world but to save the world. God's only begotten Son is God's Greatest Gift to mankind and represents His great love for a world perishing in sin and error. Our celebrations and festivities must be on our gratitude to God for His Indescribable Gift (John 3:16).

Santa Claus only gives gifts to those who've been nice and rejects those who have been naughty. But the Lord loves all of us irrespective of our sin and faults. He rains blessings on both the just and the unjust (Matthew 5:45). However, we must also take note that He is Holy and Righteous. He <u>cannot</u> and <u>will not</u> continuously condone <u>nor will He</u> <u>continually tolerate our habitual indulgence in sin</u> (Proverbs 6:16-19). As per God's standards all people have sinned and fallen short of His glory. In addition to that God's Word tells us that no one can honestly consider himself/herself righteous nor good (Romans 3:10, 12 & 23). The very thought of our hearts and mind are wicked and evil (Mark 7: 20-23). Even our so-called righteousness are like

filthy blood soaked rags (Isaiah 64:6). Do any of us need to be taught how to lie, steal, deceive, hate, envy, lust after, and so on... I'm sure all of us know exactly what I'm talking about. These sinful thoughts and instincts are inborn in all of us, irrespective of the integrity and decency of our family upbringing. As per God's standards, none of us deserve anything except hell. So who is Santa Claus going to have to give gifts to? I think he too would most definitely need to be saved (if he ever existed).

But there is still Hope! Christmas is a season that celebrates hope of a better future where sin and death will no longer be issues that man has to contend with. But we can only partake of this future only if we <u>first believe and accept</u> God's greatest Gift to us; the <u>LORD JESUS CHRIST</u> and all that He's done for us and <u>as a **result**</u> of believing in Him good works and righteous living <u>must</u> flow from our lives (Ephesians 2:8-10). It doesn't matter whether you've been naughty or nice. You can freely accept Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord. Even if Santa forgot you, don't worry; God Didn't. Won't you accept God's greatest Gift to you? Just come to Him as you are.

I'd like to conclude by quoting a part of Philips Brooks composition "O Little Town of Bethlehem". Let this be our prayer, not just for this Christmas, but all throughout our lives in our walk with our God.

"<u>O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray</u> <u>Cast out our sin and enter in be born to us today</u> We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell <u>O come to us, abide with us our Lord Emmanuel</u>"

Traditions of Christmas

The term X Max instead of 'Christmas' is Greek in origin. The word for 'Christ' in Greek is 'xristos'. Eventually, X Mas came to be both an accepted and suitable alternative to the word 'Christmas'. The festivities began in the middle of December and continued until January 1st. Visibility of the invisible God is Christmas.

According to some legends, the Christian celebration of Christmas was invented to compete with the pagan festivals held in December. The 25th was sacred not only to the Romans, but also the Persians. Christmas means 'Christ's Mass' and is the celebration of Jesus Christ's birth and baptism. In 137 AD, the bishop of Rome ordered that the birthday of Jesus Christ be observed as a solemn feast. In 375 AD it was finally announced that the birth of Jesus would be honoured on this day.

The colours often associated with Christmas decorating are green, red, white, blue, silver and gold. The green represents everlasting life, red represents the bloodline of Jesus Christ, blue represents the sky from where the angels appeared, white represents the purity of virgin birth and silver and gold represent the richness of God's blessings.

The three wise men who followed the star and reached Bethlehem to worship the child – baby Christ – the eldest of them was Melchior, King of Arabia and he was 60 years old. The youngest was named Gaspar who was 20 years old. The third monarch was Balthazar, King

of Sheba and he was 40 years old. The three kings began their journey west. They travelled across lonely desert and windy mountain plains, guided always by the star. They reached Jerusalem and conversed with Herod before continuing on their way. All around the world, so it is said, the air was filled with beautiful fragrance. The children gathered near the crude cradle; one of them a small girl named Madelon was weeping because she did not have anything to offer to the baby – Christ. Suddenly, Gabriel stood before her and struck the ground with his staff and while petalled flowers with gold hearts appeared. Madelon picked the blossoms and carried them to the cradle. Her gift was Christmas Rose.

Melchior had brought 30 gold coins to crown the little King. Balthazar's gift was frankincense, a token of divinity. Gaspar's gift was bitter myrrh, thus a sign of death that the child would later experience. The three kings took 2 years to reach their homes. Each of the three kings lived to a very old age and before each died, the star that had led them appeared again before their eyes.

The sending of greeting cards at Christmas truly began during the Victorian era. Now, in America, Christmas cards are sold for more than 30 million dollars.

The very first practice of decorating the Christmas Tree was introduced by Albert, the husband of Queen Victoria in 1840. The tradition of a Christmas tree spread across America during the 1800's with the arrival of German immigrants. Christmas tree lights were first mass produced in 1890. Christmas trees are grown in all American States.


According to ancient tradition, Christmas carols should strictly bear the narrative of St.Luke which has three distinct points: the recitative of the Angel of the Lord, the choir of the multitude of angels and the reaction of the shepherds.



Christmas Gifts



The Christrmas story is a wonderful one; it belongs to the realm of magic, for it has angels speaking to human beings, it has stars brighter than we have ever seen and it has at its centre a baby. The angels even direct the parents to name the baby. A wicked king, like in the fairy tales of old, sends his soliders to kill the baby, but the baby escapes, as the parents flee with him to a far-off land. The magic ends here, and the mundane takes over. The next we hear of this baby is that he is growing up as a young boy in subjection to his parents, who are humble, pious Jews in an obscure village in Galilee in the land of Palestine. His name is Jesus, and he lives a fully human life, shouldering the responsibility of the home after his father's death. After he turns 30, he chooses his own vocation, that of an itinerant preacher, and leaves home.

Once again we enter a realm of extraordinary happenings 'Jesus' ministry explodes into great healings, zealous presentations of the Kingdom of Heaven and warnings of the judgement of God. Finally His revelation of Himself as the Son of God, ("Do you accuse me of blasphemy, because I said, I am the Son of God?") leads to His crucifixion. But his rising to life after 3 days, authenticates His claim to be the Son of God. He lives for ever and shares the lives of the believers.

His resurrection is the crowning glory of His life; the gift of His everliving presence with us who believe, is the best Christmas gift we all receive.

About 50 years ago there lived in the countryside of Wales, a very good doctor. He was in charge of a large district and his patients lived far away from each other. One cold rainy night, the doctor received a phone call from one of his patients that he was in great pain and faced an imminent heart attack. The doctor put on his coat, boots and muffler, and taking his black bag and torch tramped through the snow to reach his patient. What was his surprise to see the patient himself,

opening the door, looking hale and heaty. And he said he had never telephoned the doctor. The mystery was solved a few days later when the police caught a notorious robber who had murdered many of his victims. Among the many crimes he confessed to, was the intended attack on the doctor whom he had telephoned, pretending to be the patient. "I was waiting to pounce on the doctor in the middle of the lonely moor, when I saw that the doctor was not alone. Walking by his side was a taill, hefty man and I fled". Jesus walked along with this doctor on his merciful errand, unknown to him. So God is with us in our sorrows and joys, in our dangers and triumphs. Emmanuel, God with us.

The secoind cause for joy at Christmas is sounded in the angels' song to the shepherds on the hills of Bethlehem. Hitherto man's concept of God was that He was an omnipotent being who knew all the wrong things we had done and who would punish us suitably. And so we were afraid of God. But the angels sang that a child had been born who would bring peace and good will to all men. This was a great revelation. God was not an angry God waiting to pounce on us when we go astray, but a good shepherd who would come after us, seeking us with a heart of love. We see the face of God when Jesus heals the sick, cleanses the lepers, opens the eyes of the blind, feeds the poor and heals the broken hearted. Above all we see the heart of God when He calls every man to love each other as Jesus loved us.

The 3rd gift of Christmas is found in the name the angel asked Joseph to give to Mary's son - Jesus - "for he shall save his people from their sins' Jesus means 'Saviour'. All of us commit sins, some big, some small. But Jesus saves us from the consequences of these sins, when we repent and ask for the forgiveness of God. This way He fits us for heaven. Forgiveness is the great gift of Jesus. This was what He gave to the thief who repented. "Today thou shalt be with Me in paradise." This word is our assurance as we also journey on to paradise.

Banana Cashew Cake for Christmas

| Eggs (Large) | - | 2 |
|-----------------------------|---|-----------|
| Banana (Large) | - | 2 |
| Sugar | - | 1 1/4 cup |
| Butter | - | 1/2 cup |
| Curd | - | 1/2 cup |
| Vanilla Essence | - | 2 tsp |
| Maida | - | 2 cups |
| Baking Powder | - | 1 tsp |
| Baking Soda | - | 1 tsp |
| 1 Pinch Salt | | |
| Cashew | - | 150 gm |
| (Indicated Cup Size 200 ml) | | |

Step 1 :

Beat eggs, Sugar, Butter, Curd, Vanilla essence and sliced bananas in a mixie. Pour into a vessel

Step 2 :

Sift Maida, Baking Power, Soda, Salt together and pour into the same vessel and mix well. Mix 1 tablespoon Maida with broken cashew and add to the batter. Sprinkle some on top for decoration.

Pre heat oven at 180°c in convection mode. Grease and dust with Maida a 8 inches diameter baking dish. Pour the batter in to the dish and brake for 50 minutes (convection). Take out the dish and let it cool before cutting.
