Psalm 136

The Kirk Men's Fellowship

The Kirk Men's Fellowship started with the objective of empowering men of the church to grow spiritually in Christ to become better husbands, fathers, brothers, sons, and leaders. This flows directly from the vision of our church, 'To be obedient disciples of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ'. The aim of the fellowship is also to have men contribute meaningfully to the life and ministries of our church.

All the meetings and activities are organized based on these objectives, including the sharing of testimonies, men sharing and praying for each other, relevant quizzes, games, and of course, Spirit led speakers on topics of relevance. The last year was a challenge due to the pandemic, but the fellowship pivoted to online meetings that continued to empower the men spiritually.

We began the year with a two-part workshop on 'Marriages that thrive for the glory of God' by Valentine Davidar that explored Godly marriages from a Biblical perspective. We had Ramachandran Periasamy, a convert who works in the civil administration of Singapore full time, is Missions Pastor of his church, and is actively involved in church planting in India and other developing countries, speak on responding to God's call.

Pastor Isaac spoke on, 'The faith led family' that was a blessing during these challenging times, while Victor Anandakumar spoke on, 'Standing in the gap for your family'. Valentine Davidar on 'Men as role models' challenged the men to be Christ like, starting with their families. Dr. Rebecca Vedamanikam spoke on, 'Are you the fifth Gospel?', another challenging topic. The speakers actually facilitated learning with interactive sessions with active participation from the men.

Feedback from the men has been greatly encouraging with the topics very relevant and applicable in their lives – to the extent some of their wives attend! The fellowship is also emerging as a brotherhood to which they can belong, fraternize with like minded men, share

with each other and pray for each other. It is a place where they can be themselves as brothers without pressure. Volunteers are increasingly willing to participate in the life of the church in various ways.

The in-person Christmas celebration saw the active participation of over thirty men for a time of Christmas hymns and songs, worship, games and a quiz. Prashant Lazarus of the Urban Ministry spoke on the need to express the love of Christ to the homeless and less fortunate around us. Followed by Pastor Isaac who exhorted the men to participate in the Urban Ministry by showing the love that came down at Christmas. The men of the fellowship also took part in the Christmas Sharing Sale with family stalls, as well as a Men's Fellowship stall, to raise funds for missions in need.

What does the future hold? Participation in prayer walks in the areas around the church; in the evangelism ministry in outreach areas; and workshops & training in addition to the regular meetings to continue to empower the men as led by the Spirit.

Green initiatives at the Kirk

As part of the special initiatives to commemorate the 200th year of the church, an Environment Committee was formed to discuss and initiate measures to improve the environment of the Church campus. The members of the Environment Committee, Vivek Harinarain, Sabrina Siga, Abha Appasamy, Justin Ranjit and Daisy James discussed ways to increase the green cover around the church, beautify it and make the Kirk campus a bio-diverse green haven in the city.

The Committee, after discussions with the Secretary, engaged Mr. Ranjan Paul, retired Joint Director of Agriculture, whose passion is to use his talents and expertise in horticulture to help churches create greener and more beautiful surroundings. After a few rounds of discussions and campus visits, it was decided to do the work in phases, beginning with planting a green belt along the periphery of the church where feasible, pruning of the existing trees to improve their canopies, and planting flowering trees in available spaces. Such an initiative would check the noise and dust from traffic, attract birds, butterflies and bees to the flowering trees, and enhance both the flora and fauna on the campus that future generations of worshippers could enjoy as they fellowshipped in the grounds.

The initial work of pruning existing trees and planting the green belt began before serious onset of the monsoon on Sunday, 31st October. The planting of flowering trees by congregation members was planned on the following Sunday, the 6th of November, but had to be postponed due to heavy rains and flooding of the pits. On November 14th, as the weather was good, it was decided to go ahead and plant the saplings after the 9 am service with Pastor Isaac Johnson, Dulip Thangasamy our Secretary, Dr Prasanna Rao and family, Ruth & Praveen Alexander and Sudha & John Ravinder planting the first few flowering trees at select spots near the Asha School. Dr. Prasanna Rao and his family were invited to plant the first tree in memory of his wife and our elder, Mrs Premanjali Rao, who passed away last

year. It was a poignant moment for all, and an emotional one for the family as they planted an African Tulip in her memory.

In all, 120 saplings were planted during this first phase: 115 fast growing Conocarpus trees for the green belt along Poonamallee High Road, 2 African Tulips, 2 Lagerstroemia, and 1 Golden Shower. This is in addition to the 154 trees already on the campus. In phase 2, the green belt will be extended along the wall opposite the front entrance of the church bordering Egmore Station, and more flowering trees will be planted in designated spots around the campus. The Conocarpus trees in the green belt are expected to grow 25 feet tall in three years and will be an effective barrier against dust, noise and smoke pollution, and also release more oxygen into the atmosphere.

While planting a Lagerstroemia sapling near the entrance of the ASHA project, Pastor Isaac Johnson said, "We must remember that the first trees were not planted, but created. And man was placed in the garden to work it and look after it. Similarly, we must be good stewards of His creation. We are so grateful for the beauty of our campus, and must work towards enhancing it to God's glory".

The Secretary of the Kirk Session, Mr Dulip Thangasamy, said, "We would like to go beyond the stipulated 30% green cover and make our campus an example of a model bio-diversity area with indigenous trees and greenery. Such a green campus will also be something that our members will enjoy in the years to come. We would also like to replicate this model in the outreach areas wherever we have land so that it can be enjoyed by the congregations there. The sustainability of our environment must be everyone's concern as it is a Biblical mandate, and we are happy to be able to do this in a meaningful way".

We at the Kirk are fortunate to have been blessed with a beautiful campus. The Environment Committee is happy to follow members like Mrs. Sneha Pandian and Mrs. Nalini Simon and to have an opportunity to professionally enhance and develop our campus into a bio-diverse green haven in the city. We are grateful to Mr Ranjan Paul for his passion and willingness to lend his expertise in this effort. We hope in time to add a greater variety of trees and plants and set an example for other institutions, of caring for the environment in every possible way.

MENTAL AND EMOTIONAL HEALTH PEACE AND JOY

Why is it that we have everything but peace and joy these days? This is because our lives are dominated by fear, anxiety and worry!

A 17 year old boy came to me a few days back with serve headache not responding to any medication. All the medical tests were normal. As I was counseling him I realized that he was going to appear for plus two examination and he was full of anxiety about, "how would I fare in the exams?" Whether he would fulfill the expectations of his parents and teachers? How many marks would he get? What would be his future if he did not get the course/College of his choice? Anxiety and stress were the causes of his headache!

Another plus two student came with severe burning sensation in his eyes, because of which he could not study. On examination his eyes were absolutely normal. An anxious couple brought their daughter (plus two student) who felt sleepy every time she opened her books to study. They wanted to know if she had any organic eye problem which was responsible for this.

These are just a few examples of Psycho-Somatic disorders (P.S.D). Millions of people all over the world are suffering from P.S.D. with different symptoms and manifestations. Before labeling a person as having PSD, all efforts must be made to rule out organic physical diseases. Symptomatic treatment gives immediate, but temporary relief, so counseling is an essential part of treatment.

Our Lord Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30 NJV).
