One of the verses from the book of Colossians which keeps coming back to my mind over the past few days is to 'Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving.' (Col.4:2).

The Psalmist said in Psalm 27:14 'Wait on the Lord; be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart; wait, I say, on the Lord!'

- We need to wait on the Lord because He loves honest talk.
- We need to wait on the Lord because with Him, there is forgiveness of sins (Psalm 130:3)
- We need to wait on the Lord in what the Father wants for us: 'Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven (Matt.6:10). 'Your will be done for us' we are choosing to be at one with God.
- We need to wait on the Lord because Jesus our Lord has broken down the wall of separation. He is our Mediator so that nothing can disrupt our relationship with God. He offered a sacrifice acceptable to God.
- We are encouraged to go into the presence of God in His Name (Heb.4:14-16).

Given below is a simple guide to use when praying for others:

- When you fold your hands, the thumb is nearest you. So begin by praying for those closest to you your loved ones (Phil.1:3-5).
- The index finger is the pointer. Pray for those who teach Bible teachers, preachers, and for those who teach children (1 Thes.5:25).
- The next finger is the tallest. It reminds you to pray for those in authority over you national and state leaders and those in power (1 Tim.2:1-2).

- The fourth finger is usually the weakest. Pray for those who are in trouble or who are suffering (the persecuted Church) (James 5:13-16).
- Then comes your little finger. It reminds you of your smallness in relation to God's greatness. Ask Him to supply your needs (Phil.4:19).

Whatever method we use or you use, just talk with your Father. He wants you to pray.

"Our prayers ascend to heaven's throne regardless of the form we use;

Our Father always hears His own, regardless of the words we choose" - D.DeHaan.

"Lord, teach us to pray" should be our prayer.

A Garden East of Eden?

'The Lord God planted a garden eastward in Eden: and there he put the man whom he had formed' Gen.2:8

St. Andrew's Church 'the Kirk' was a gift from Scottish missionaries to our fathers in 1820. So it is our duty to take care of this place.

In 2000, the Kirk stood, a huge tall structure in a vast area of space dotted with ancient trees. But the immediate area around the church was bare – so the Garden Project was started to beautify it with lawns and flowering plants. 13 years of hard work by the Garden Committee have wrought a miracle – flowering bougainvillea and hibiscus plants line the long avenue from the gate to the imposing steps, the continuous rows of steps along the round periphery of the church display potted plants like the desert rose, and multicoloured bougainvillea, and patches of green lawns border the steps.

The Committee has had to battle the harsh weather conditions of Chennai. Water scarcity is a perennial problem. This past year, the bore well water dried up forcing them to fall back on the nursery well and the Metrowater supply which is normally reduced in summer. However, the Committee relying on the promise in Deuteronomy 28:12, carried on: "The Lord will open the heavens, the storehouse of his bounty, to send rain on your land in season and to bless all the work of your hands."

This year, we developed the Asha area by placing the required potted plants and laying a patch of lawn on the front slope. Now we are concentrating on the guest house in the adjoining area. The trees which were planted last year in this area are growing well.

The growth of grass and bushes is kept under control by periodic cutting. The general cleaning is done every week. But we find it very difficult to keep the place absolutely clean because of the various types of functions and meetings which take place in the campus, though waste bins are provided on all sides of the church.

The wayside tea shops on the bus stand side add to the mess, because they throw used tea cups and paper plates into the compound. Our gardeners have to clean it up daily.

The master plan of the campus is getting ready with final corrections. According to the plan, the nursery and the vegetable gardens will be

shifted. Because of this shifting threat, for the past two years, we are not able to implement our plans. But all the regular works pertaining to the nursery are being carried out and the sale of plants on a small scale is being done. The cultivation of vegetables is done according to the season.

The fruit garden is yielding for the past four years. We use only organic manure, which is generated in the garden. This year, the Committee decided to fence it so that we can improve it more by adding new varieties of trees which will thrive in this climate. This fencing will also safeguard the area from different types of pests like stray dogs, bandicoots etc. Another big danger is from the intruders who steal the fruits and other things in the campus. Nearly 15 ft. of the compound wall at the corner end beyond the fruit garden has fallen down over the past two years. Because of this, there is absolutely no security for this place in the day or in the night. We request priority to be given to this issue.

Last year was a very difficult one for the project. During the revival meeting time, we decided to remove all the potted plants from the driveways and the project sites to a safer place since a large crowd was expected. We left the potted plants around the church. Nevertheless, two pots which contained rare varieties of plants just disappeared.

Then came the monsoon rains and, as usual, the campus got flooded. Without much forethought, the rainwater gutter construction was started in the manse and day care areas. The Garden project was not informed of this work. The net result was, all the plants on the ground in the manse and day care areas were destroyed. Trees and tree branches were also cut unnecessarily. In the process, a fruit tree with the fruits was destroyed. It took a long time for the project to clear this mess. Well, progress is essential as years roll by, but it should be well planned.

On this beautiful Eco-Sunday, we thank God for all His blessings which He has showered on this project throughout the year. On behalf of the Committee, I thank the pastors, the congregation, the Kirk Session, the office staff and the gardeners for rendering a helping hand for the growth of this project.

Kirk Youth Fellowship Report

(June 2013 - June 2014)

I would like to present the schedule followed by us every month

- 1st week Time of Activities and discussion
- 2nd week Outreach Sunday
- 3rd week Bible study
- 4th week Catalyst
- 5th week Time of witnessing and prayer / Outreach

This year, we have introduced home fellowship where every 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Friday we meet up for a time of worship, discussion and prayer in the home of one of the youth members.

Every fourth Sunday, Catalyst, a unique youth service is conducted where there is a time of worship, a sermon and some activities, and also the Koinonia service which happens on the fourth week in the evening.

Theme verse

In the previous year, up to December, we had been dwelling on "Abiding in Christ" based on John15. From this January, the theme verse for this year is II Timothy 1:12 – I know whom I have believed and I am convinced that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him for that day. This verse has been divided into Knowing, transforming, action and perfection. Upto April we have been focusing on "Knowing" the attributes of Jesus Christ and from June onwards we will be studying the timeline on the life of the apostle Paul based on the remaining three sections.

Outreach programmes

The youth are continuing the Outreach programmes which usually take place in the second week of every month.

During the year, we have visited,

- Friend In Need Society in June and also in October, during which a Bible study was conducted involving the residents.
- We have also visited Amaithi Illam in August and Doughlas home in September where there was a time of praise and worship in Tamil and English. Skits were performed on various themes and activities and games were conducted involving the children. Gifts were distributed and lunch was also provided.

• During the months of November, December and January the youth have distributed tracts in the vicinity of the Egmore railway station just outside our church as a part of the outreach initiative. It was a very enriching time when we got an opportunity to spread the gospel to non Christians and Christians as well. There were many incidents which really touched us and it only increased our burden to be more actively involved in working for the kingdom of God.

One such incident was when one group gave a tract to a man sleeping near the bus stop; he was so touched that someone would actually come and talk to him. He became very emotional as he said that he was only there because of the 1Re meals provided nearby and he didn't think he was worth being talked to. It was a very humbling experience as it made us realise how freely the gospel was available to us and how very often we take it for granted.

Another incident was when all our Tamil and English tracts were over and only tracts which we thought were Telugu were remaining but we could see God's intervention when we noticed a bus which was broken down transporting people from Karnataka. So we thought we could anyway give it hoping that a few might know Telugu and when we gave out the tracts we realised from them that they were in fact Kannada tracts.

We will continue the tract distribution God willing even in the coming year.

One of our youth members has also designed a tract in Tamil called "Nija superstar Yesu" which is being printed and will be used in the future.

- From the month of February onwards till April, we have directed our outreach programs towards the *Thirupalaivanam village* project where we are helping out in the music and praise & worship. After participating in the service we are encouraging their youth fellowship by conducting a Bible study and discussion. We have also started spoken English classes for which 10-12 youth have enrolled and music classes where 6 youth have registered. The practices for the music lessons are received with great enthusiasm.
- In the month of April, the youth visited the Poovami village
 just outside of Thirupalaivanam, where a Palm Sunday
 procession and a skit on the life of Christ was portrayed in
 Tamil on the

streets. The youth of the Thirupalaivanam church were also involved in this portrayal. It was a very encouraging and blessed time where the word of God was spread to 200 odd people who were gathered around.

Youth Camp

The youth camp was conducted from 9th to 11th of August in Nandi Hills, Bangalore. The Speaker for the camp was Pastor Vasudhevan. Around 35 youth attended the camp and the theme was "Jars of clay – unveiled".

Other programmes

Various programs were conducted by the youth during the Christmas season.

- The church Christmas play and a choreography done on 8th December in the evening service.
- The carol rounds for the sick and the all night carol rounds.
- Participation in The Christmas sale.
- Conducting the Christmas campfire.
- The youth helped out in the Church camp conducted this January by leading the worship and conducting the campfire.
- The youth also volunteered in helping out with the VBS.

Future plans

The worship team of the youth are in the process of composing a music album which will, God willing, be completed by the end of next year. During one Catalyst as part of an activity, the youth composed 6 songs which will be included in the album.

The youth plan to continue to reach out to other young people in the congregation in order to bring all the youth together under the leadership of Christ and be more involved in the various activities in the church.

Conclusion

We would request the congregation to continue to support and encourage us with your prayers in all our current and future endeavours. We would like to thank God again who enables us to grow and sustains us from strength to strength.

Medical Corner

ALLERGY IN THE BODY - IV

ALLERGIC OCCUPATIONAL LUNG DISEASE - II

"Doctors treat, but Jesus heals".

In certain occupations, the inhalation of dusts, fumes or other noxious substances may give rise to specific pathological changes is the lungs. The risk of these forms of occupational lung disease in highest in spray painters, shipyard and dock workers, miners and quarrymen, welders, electronic assembly workers and those that work in the construction industry or in chemical processing. Prolonged exposure to these allergens (inorganic dusts) lead to destruction of normal lung tissue and scarring (fibrosis) occurs. Industrial gases and fumes can cause acute lung diseases like accumulation of fluid in the lungs (pulmonary oedema) and asthma.

It is very essential to take a detailed occupational history, both present and past, since a diagnosis of occupational lung disease can easily be overlooked and patient may be eligible for compensation. A long period of dust exposure is required before X-ray (radiological) changes appear. These may be present even before the patient starts clinical symptoms. Lung function tests may reveal decreased lung volumes. Those who are exposed to asbestos, the risk of bronchial cancer is extremely high, especially in patients who also smoke.

The diagnosis in made by careful history taking, x-ray and lung function tests. Biopsy of Lung tissue may also be indicated in some patients. Improvements in standard of industrial hygiene are now enforced by law in many countries. Such measures as wearing respirators, damping dust and efficient ventilation systems are already proving effective in a number of industries. The treatment is variable. Each case is assessed carefully and treatment is according to the clinical and radiological findings. Respiratory failure is treated appropriately by the lung specialist (pulmonologist).

The Woman of Shunem, Shunammite

II Kings 4:8-37

Her name is never given in this passage, she lived in Shunem, in the territory of Issacher near Jazreel. Henea her name the Shunammite. She was a, well-to-do woman. She was married but had no children. Her husband was old too. She provided hospitality to the prophet Elisha, the man of God, who lived at Mt. Carmel. He frequented her house regularly as her house lay between Samaria and Mt. Carmel. With her husband's consent, she built in their house a room for the prophet, with a bed, a table, a chairf and a lamp for his use.

Now prophet Elisha wanted to repay her kindness and so asked her oneday whether she wanted any favour from the king or the commander of the army. But she turned down his offer with graciousness saying that she was satisfied with her life, as she lived it.

Still the prophet, knowing that she was barren promised her a son and she got a son the next year. But alas! oneday the child died on her lap, after a brief illness. She might have surely thought that it would have been better to have had no child, then to have one and then to lose him

As a woman of faith, she never raised on alarm but believed that the prophet Elisha, the man of God, alone could restore to her what he had given to her. She laid the dead boy on the prophets bed and went in search of him. She found him at Mt. Carmel and pleeded with him to go with her and restore the child's life.

Now Elisha, seeing her distress, went with her and entered the room where the dead boy was laid. We read that Elisha gave the boy a treatment, as no other physician could do to bring the life back to him. The child's return back to life and his reunion with his mother are simply and touchingly told in the Bible.

Here, we see a resurrection through the Lord's prophet. God had once more manifested His power over death. When Christ raised His friend, the dead Lazarus back to life, He proved He is surely the Lord of life. We who serve the risen saviour, by our faith can experience the same power of God in our lives too. To any situation that may look hopeless and beyond redemption, God can give life and restore it nto us.

The Shunammite's kindness, contantment in her life, persistence and unshakable faith made her experience the power of God. What a wonderful faith she had!
