Why Pray?



When I pray, I visualise Jesus at the right hand of God and I address my prayers to Him. At times, I feel He is very close to me and listens to my words. But at other times, I feel like the devout Jew who having thrust his prayer missive into a crevice in the Western Wall at Jerusalem, prayed for peace – for himself, his family and his Jewish nation. When asked what answer he received, he said, "It is like hitting at this wall."

Then, if I feel that my prayer is just a torrent of heartfelt longings, and I am uncertain as to who or whether anybody listens to them, why do I pray?

I pray because I can't help it. I need to put into words my horror at the evil of this world and my yearning for righteousness, justice and mercy to prevail. It is not that I doubt the power of God to fell at one stroke the murderers, the rapists and the selfish humans of this world. But books like Revelation counsel patience and I cry, how long Lord?

The second reason I pray is because Jesus prayed. His prayers were answered, but many a time they were not answered the way he expected. He prayed for feeding the five thousand, and miraculously, the loaves and fishes multiplied themselves. Before raising Lazarus, he prayed and then affirmed, "Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard my prayer", and later, "I know that thou hearest me always". So we can be sure that God hears our prayers. But often the answers are not what we want. "Remove this cup from me", Jesus prayed. The cup was not removed. He agonized on the cross, "My God! Why have you forsaken me?" Jesus felt, like us, that there was no one out there to share his darkest hour. Yet he always reiterated that men ought always to pray and not to lose heart. However, Jesus always maintained that there was an inevitable connect to effective prayer. When the woman with the issue of blood touched his garment hoping for a cure he assured her, "Daughter, thy faith had made thee whole, go in peace". Similarly, when the father of the epileptic boy besought Jesus for a cure, he said, "All things are possible to him that believeth". The father answered, "Lord, I believe, help thou mine unbelief." Most of us walk in that man's shoes.

Uppermost on our prayer list are our selfish concerns. Jesus did not find fault with that. "That I may see." The leper cried, "If thou wilt thou canst make me clean". " I will, be thou clean."

I am sure when the Roman centurion petitioned Jesus for his servant, Jesus honoured the intercessory nature of his prayer and exclaimed, "I have not found so great a faith, no, not in Israel."

When the intercessory prayer ministry of my church appeals for prayer, on behalf of the sick in other countries, people who are total strangers, I could not fall in line till my Pastor asked me, "How did the Christians in England, by no means rich, send missionaries to India and pray for them and support their ministry financially? The great missionary movements in the late 19th century in India and China were firmly grounded on the prayers of people living far away and unlikely ever to see the missionaries or the people they led to Christ. But they could feel for the sacrificial lives of these ministers and the trials of the people who responded to their gospel. So they got together in two's or three's or bigger groups and prayed for them consistently. So must we.

Colourful Way to be Thankful

'The choice of being grateful' – can sound to be quite ordinary when its repetitive – but this choice, reminded as part of the VBS theme this year can become very thought provoking! The world around us says 'Thank you' quite often and has a lot of colourful ways in expressing it too!! Schools and Institutions teach respect and code of conduct in and through the word 'thank you'. But the deeper we dig into the treasured Word of God, the more we can understand and experience the special relationship in the word 'Thank you'.

Sharing a few aspects of this 'special thank you' from the well known Psalm 100 the first verse "Shout for Joy to the Lord all the Earth" resounds and literally bursts in to our ears. And of course we can see that the choice of being grateful becomes the 'best choice' as we move on through Psalm '100' worshipping and knowing the Lord, entering His gates and tasting the Lord's love and faithfulness through generations. Rooted and built up in CHRIST; Strengthened in the faith as we were taught and overflowing with thanksgiving, worship becomes the passion of our

Knowing that the Lord is near and in control of every situation is a calling for rejoicing in the Lord, as the Psalmist rightly points out that we are the sheep of His pasture. Getting rid of anxiety becomes all the more easier and in anything and everything there's a new direction for a prayerful and a thankful heart - The Peace of God that transcends all understanding guards our hearts and minds in CHRIST JESUS.

A Report on VBS 2013

By the grace of God, VBS 2013 was held from the 17th to the 27th of April at our church. The theme for this year "It's your choice" gave a wonderful platform for teachers to help the children realize the choices that are available, the choices they could be making and the choices they should be making.

To begin with, the teachers had a sound training session in which Rev. Isac Soundara Raja shared the reason and importance of this ministry along with the statistics of children at risk all around us. This was followed by a session on "Principles of Godly discipline" well handled by Mrs. Meera Ninan. Simultaneously enthusiastic volunteers (young mothers and youth) were trained in craft work by Mrs. Pallavi Pramod who had planned interesting crafts based on each day's theme.

The secret behind every ministry is prayer and this was proved again. God's presence and providence could be felt right from the word start. God in His mercy intervened twice even before VBS could begin. The power cut schedule was shifted to 12noon to 2p.m instead of 10a.m. to 12 noon which was a great relief. Also the last working day for schools was shifted to 17th instead of end of the month. God continued to provide and meet every need in beautiful ways.

We had a team of dedicated teachers and volunteers who served with great enthusiasm. Everyday powerful speakers presented the theme for the day to the various groups. This year God enabled children of DCC to be part of our VBS and they were ministered to in Tamil simultaneously. The children enjoyed theme based craft and games every day. We had a total of about 150 students including DCC children and young adults. The labor day saw children bring in so generously all they had earned by doing small chores at home. The inspection day was a tough one for the judge as each class had very creatively put up all they had learnt and also answered questions. Every day during the closing assembly the children came forward to recite the memory verses they had learnt. The love feast day was one happy occasion when the entire lot got under one roof to fellowship and have food very lovingly served by one of our members and his family.


The valedictory function was held on the 28th of April, 2013 during the evening service. Apart from the songs, memory verses and skit by the students, we had for the first time a short film on "The Conquerors" mentioned in the Bible enacted by the students of Junior and

VBS at Kirk Outreach Project Areas - 2013

VBS was conducted at various project areas such as Gypsy Colony (Pallavaram), Balaramapuram, Kosapur, Avariwakkam, Kilkuppam, Tirupalaivanam and Karanodai. Our evangelists Jayakodi, Azariah, Samuel and Santhosh with support from Evangelism & Missions Movement members planned well ahead to carry out VBS effectively in their respective locations as per the schedule from 29th April to 18th May 2013. Teachers were trained to handle different level of classes starting from Beginners to Senior level. Number of children who attended VBS this year at Gypsy Colony was around 65, at Balaramapuram 100, Kosapur 130, Avariwakkam 70, Kilkuppam 75, Tirupalaivanam 120 and Karanodai 65.

Teachers taught children with great commitment. They prepared colour charts, taught them many action songs which the children loved and enjoyed. Children memorised each day's memory verses with great interest and learnt Biblical stories and biographies of renowned missionaries. Children were also taught the importance of "work & earn" policy on the "Labour Day" and "share with others" on the "Love feast day". We are grateful and thankful to some of our congregation members who accepted our invitation and spared time to inspect the classes on "Inspection Day". We appreciate the children who though mainly from non Christian backgrounds participated regularly with eagerness to learn God's Word, despite scorching summer heat.

The keenly awaited "Final day" celebrations went on beyond one's expectation. Children had the privilege to exhibit their talents through their singing, dancing & reciting memory verses of all the six days. We thank God for enabling us to conduct VBS for the first time at Avariwakkam and Karanodai. We were amazed at the benevolence of a few Hindu families who sponsored snacks and juices for children, teachers and volunteers. At Kilkuppam, a Hindu family opened their home and shared their hut to conduct VBS. A Hindu boy from a distant village (Seerapakkam) attended VBS uninvited on the first day and brought few other friends for the following days. He was enlightened by God's word and his eyes lit up with zeal for our Saviour. All the children, teachers and volunteers were served with packed lunch after the class every day.

Most of the children were inspired and touched by God's Word and His power through VBS at all the centres. The seed has been sown and it is our responsibility to continue to pray that they would walk in obedience and faith in our Saviour Jesus Christ. All praise, honour and glory be to God our Father and Saviour Jesus Christ for enabling us to be a part of VBS.

A Report on Medical Camp and Inauguration of Clinical Laboratory at Thirupalaivanam

Our Lord made it possible to successfully conduct a Medical Camp at the Village Project clinic in Thirupalaivanam on 21.04.2013.

A full-fledged Clinical Laboratory was also inaugurated on the occasion.

A team of doctors from the Kirk including Dr.Bennett, Dr.Benjamin Ninan, Dr.Percy Sumithran, Dr.Mohan, Dr.Prasanna Rao, Dr.Thuthi Mohan and Dr.Chitra Andrew, apart from Dr.Pichamuthu from Sugam Hospital, conducted the camp.

Mr. Moorthy, Lab Technician, conducted the clinical tests during the camp.

Our Assistant Pastor Rev. Isaac Johnson thanked God for His blessings and presence and asked the Lord to guide the doctors and heal the patients visiting the Camp. He also dedicated the Clinical Laboratory to the glory of God.

Pastor read Psalm 22, followed by prayer. He cut the ribbon to inaugurate the Camp and the Lab.

Nearly 75 patients attended.

25 patients had their blood and urine tested. Asthma, Paediatric and Gynaecology patients were treated, and general check-up was done for those needing it.

Dr. Prasanna Rao arranged for representatives from Cipla to visit the clinic and distribute free medicines to asthma patients.

We praise and thank God first for His mercies in starting the Clinical Laboratory which will definitely be a great blessing for the Villagers.

Our heartfelt thanks also go to Dr.Ira Packianathan who donated Rs.2,00,000/- for the Lab.

We very gratefully acknowledge and thank Dr. Thuthi Mohan for her efforts in planning and setting up the Lab including all equipment etc., which helped us to inaugurate it successfully.

The credit for the success of the medical camp and the inauguration of the Lab goes to the Lord, His medical servants, Village Project contributors and staff, all of whom gave of their time, energy and expertise with dedication.

Medical Corner

ULCERS IN THE BODY -1 MOUTH ULCERS

I will praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; m&rvelous are your works, and that my soul knows very well (Ps 139:14 NKJV). Each one of us is an unique creation of God. When we have a disease, doctors treat but Jesus heals.

Deficiency of vitamin B2 (Riboflavin) mainly affects the tongue and lips and causes inflammation of the angles of the mouth. The richest source of riboflavin is milk and milk products. Oral tablets are also available.

Mouth ulcers (Aphthous ulcers) are superficial and painful; they occur in any part of the mouth. Recurrence of ulcers, in spite of treatment is seen in 30% of the population. Topical corticosteroid or choline salicylate (8.7%) gel can effect healing. Symptomatic relief is achieved using local anaesthetic mouthwashes. A few patients have very severe, recurrent aphthous ulcers and need oral steroids.

Mouth ulcers can also be due to Fungus (Candidiasis; oral thrush), Virus (Herpes simplex) and bacteria. Oral thrush can occur in babies, debilitated patients, patients receiving prolonged corticosteroid or antibiotic therapy. They are also seen in diabetics and immuno suppressed patients, especially those receiving cytotoxic therapy and patients with AIDS. Oral thrush is treated by anti fungal suspension or lozenges. A detailed history and investigation of the patient will identify the cause, which can be treated, appropriately.
