Word from the Pastor



"Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint." - Isaiah 40:30-33

Reading about patience when we don't have time or the interest at this present moment can be a very difficult task. The challenge about patience is not that we don't have that virtue, it is about exercising the virtue consistently in life especially when we face the following challenges:

1. Waiting in Trust

Psalm 130:5-6 says 'I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.'

Putting our lives in the hands of someone and willing to 'trust' that one would keep the promise is something all of us have experienced and sorry to mention the obvious, that all of us have been let down by others and we are guilty in some small or big way in our dealings with others. The Psalmist says that he will wait upon the Lord because our God is worthy putting our lives into His hands and He will come through in more ways than what we can possibly comprehend.

To wait on God means to pause and soberly consider our own inadequacy and the Lord's all-sufficiency, and to seek counsel and help from the Lord, and to hope in Him. The folly of not waiting for God is that we forfeit the blessing of having God work for us. The evil of not waiting on God is that we oppose God's will to exalt Himself in mercy.- John Piper

2. Waiting over Time

James 5:7-8 says, 'Therefore be patient, brethren, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious produce of the soil, being patient about it, until it gets the early and late rain. You too be patient, strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near.'

There are many things we do not understand about the ways of God and one of the most obvious ones is that about 'God's time'. It is one thing to quote from Ecclesiastes 3 but in real life when we or others around us question the 'when' turning points of our future, we are often left speechless. As someone once said, 'Time is not a healer but God is a healer'. As I am writing these words, my mind is clouded by the thoughts of a family who lost their 32 year old son who himself was a father of a 5-year old boy. How do you handle pain of this magnitude? The return of Jesus Christ when there will be a glorious reunion is the answer. It will happen but none, remember none, knows when. But the fact is – IT WILL HAPPEN.

3. Waiting in Truth

Hebrews 12:1-3 says, 'Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he **endured** the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

We all need role models in life but if there is one virtue that requires a living example, it is this virtue. It is not preachers about patience who are the need of the hour. The world needs to see Christians who practise patience. The 'BEST' example of patience is Jesus Himself. He **endured** the cross. This is patience in its ultimate sense. When bad things are meted against Godly people, it is the virtue of patience that can take one through such storms. Is it difficult? Very much. But God gives us the strength and He will guide us one day at a time, one step at a time and every step of the way. I close with these words. Waiting in Truth is Patience as against waiting to deceive which is crookedness. Remember the very words of Jesus (traditionally called the 7th word) from the Cross. "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit".

Patience is a lifelong virtue, learned from birth to death, to be exercised in increasing measure believing that God will complete the good work He has begun and what you are waiting on Him for.

Purpose of life - Part 10

We saw in the earlier "Part 9" that our God knows the future and if he had chosen to keep the tree of knowledge of good and evil in spite of knowing very well that Adam and Eve would eat from it and die, it would not have been for mere testing but for something far beyond that.

Reason and Logic.

If there are 10 bottles kept on a wall and if we ask a sharp shooter to shoot one and if he shoots successfully we would then confidently say that there should be 9 bottles remaining. However, when it comes to 10 birds on a tree and one is shot successfully, we would not say that nine would remain. We would say **none would remain** as all the rest would have flown after hearing the gunshot! **We apply reason and logic.**

Similar reason and logic we don't seem to apply when it comes to Adam. We presume that it would have been possible for him to have refrained from eating from the forbidden tree. Normally when someone is subjected to test there would be a time frame; say a day, week, month or even years. Never would it be for infinity. If it is for infinity, as in this case, in all probability one day or the other the forbidden act would occur. God would have known it for sure. For otherwise He would not have kept the lamb to be slain **even before the creation of the world**, meaning even before the creation of Garden of Eden and before planting the tree of knowledge of good and evil as could be seen from the following passage.

*For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your forefathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect. **He was chosen before the creation of the world**, but was revealed in these last times for your sake. 1 Peter 1:18-21*

We must ask Questions.

If we have to understand the mystery behind God keeping the Lamb to be slain even before the creation of the world, we must then ask questions and seek for answers from God as God only can reveal His plans and secrets.

Basic Questions

1. Being aware of the potential trespass, while God had a choice to keep or not to keep the 'Tree of knowledge of knowing good and evil', why did He then decide to keep the tree?

What is the reason?

2. If it is not for testing, for He would have known the outcome even before the test, what's the purpose behind keeping the tree?
3. Normally punishment follows disobedience. Why did not God punish Adam and Eve with instant death, as He had warned them, the moment they disobeyed, but allowed them to live?
4. Generally we bring in another person or a couple if the first one fails. God chose Joshua to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land when Moses failed. He failed at the desert of Zin to honor God in front of the Israelites when he struck the rock instead of speaking to get water (Num 20:12). God chose David as king when King Saul failed. (1Samuel 15:35 & 16:1) Why then did God not choose another couple in place of Adam and Eve when they failed?
5. With prohibition comes the curiosity. When you display a board "**WET PAINT, DON'T TOUCH**", then only one may be **tempted to touch** and check.
6. God did not command any of His other creations with such prohibition except humans. Why?

There are so many similar questions. Some may say we should not ask questions. Only mankind can ask such questions and seek for answers.

Vacation Bible School

The theme for this year's VBS was "Get Connected" based on Ephesians 2.19. The VBS at Kirk was held between April 18 and 29, 2018. We had around 200 children this year from 45 schools and 31 churches. Children eagerly learnt about God, His word and the songs. About 60 teachers and volunteers committed their time and effort to teach, nourish and guide these children.

Each day started with devotion time where teachers and volunteers met for a time of prayer and Bible meditation on Getting connected with God and children and the different aspects of God's Grace. The children were abundantly blessed by the daily singing session based on the VBS themes like Getting connected to the Creator, Getting connected to Jesus for deliverance, for salvation, in faith, for growth, for service etc. The children learnt about a Bible character and a missionary story all the 10 days. They also memorized verses from the Bible.

There were separate classes for Beginners, Primary, Juniors, Inters, Seniors and Young Adults. Each group had a well-planned schedule-Bible lesson, memory verses, activities and missionary stories. Young adults, a bunch of super active and enthusiastic children had the privilege of having different people from our church counselling and training them on life issues. Topics were chosen specifically for their age group which would help them take the right decisions based on Christian values and principles as they venture out into this world.

Children were given healthy snacks every day and the day's programme ended with a devotion time. The afternoon session was held separately for Tamil VBS, Beginners, Primary and others. These sessions were handled by different teachers and this made the sessions very interesting and lively. The children of the Beginner and Primary classes enjoyed the finger play time and songs which were taught to them.

This year props based on the theme for that particular day like birds, stars, hearts, growth charts, security equipments, power packs were meticulously designed and made by Mrs. Rani Williams. The children

participated enthusiastically in all the special days like friendship day, sports day, cleanliness day, inspection day, prayer day, labour day and day of love feast.

All the stories, songs and activities were pointed towards Christ and taught about the importance of getting connected with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, the only connection which lasts forever. As someone said, the will of God will not take us where the grace of God cannot sustain us, we thank God for His abundant grace that sustained us all the ten days.

It Can Increase our Energy Levels

Exercise can be a real energy booster for healthy people, as well as those suffering from various medical conditions. One study found that six weeks of regular exercise reduced feelings of fatigue for 36 healthy people who had reported persistent fatigue. Furthermore, exercise can significantly increase energy levels for people suffering from chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS) and other serious illnesses. In fact, exercise seems to be more effective at combating CFS than other treatments, including passive therapies like relaxation and stretching, or no treatment at all.

Additionally, exercise has been shown to increase energy levels in people suffering from progressive illnesses, such as cancer, HIV/AIDS and multiple sclerosis.

It Can Reduce our Risk of Chronic Disease

Lack of regular physical activity is a primary cause of chronic disease. Regular exercise has been shown to improve insulin sensitivity, cardiovascular fitness and body composition, yet decrease blood pressure and blood fat levels. In contrast, a lack of regular exercise — even in the short term — can lead to significant increases in belly fat, which increases the risk of type 2 diabetes, heart disease and early death. Therefore, daily physical activity is recommended to reduce belly fat and decrease the risk of developing these diseases.

It Can Help Skin Health

Your skin can be affected by the amount of oxidative stress in your body. Oxidative stress occurs when the body's antioxidant defenses cannot completely repair the damage that free radicals cause to cells. This can damage their internal structures and deteriorate your skin.

Even though intense and exhaustive physical activity can contribute to oxidative damage, regular moderate exercise can increase your body's production of natural antioxidants, which help protect cells. In the same way, exercise can stimulate blood flow and induce skin cell adaptations that can help delay the appearance of skin aging.
