#### Stand for Jesus

Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. (Ephesians 6:13)

King David, of the wonderful men of God, is known for many things but what he says as recorded in Psalm 27:4 is simply phenomenal. # Riber Memorial Day Care Centre and ASHA–VBS 2023

By God's grace Vacation Bible School (VBS) was conducted for 25 children of RMDCC and their siblings and 48 children of ASHA at their respective centers from April 24 to April 29, 2023, on the theme 'Champions for Jesus'. A typical day consisted of Teachers Devotion, General Session with songs, Bible stories and classes reiterating the truths learnt. Children were given refreshments and lunch. Special days included the Encouragement Day and Love Feast Day.

Each day children learnt Bible stories and made visual representation of the truths they learnt. Children learnt that they can, like Job, do the right things with God's help and make God happy. To walk by faith like Elisha, they asked God to open their spiritual eyes. These lessons and their representative craft work werea blessing to them and a great learning not only for the children but also for the teachers, volunteers and for parents who sat through the sessions.

Teachers'devotion stressed on a closer walk with God focusing on aspects of love, forgiveness, patience, prayer and goodness. Teachers were challenged to live out their faith. Parents'Day was a blessing to families as they were reminded of the love of God and God's choice


We are grateful for the passionate dedication of the staff of St. Mark's school. We praise God for His faithfulness throughout the VBS which was a blessing to many children.



# ULCERS IN THE BODY – II PEPTIC ULCER

"Doctors treat, but Jesus heals"

Ulcers in the lower part of the food pipe (oesophagus), in the stomach, and in the upper part of the small intestine (duodenum) are referred to as peptic ulcers. It affects approximately 10% of all adults at sometime in their lives. The cause of peptic ulcer is infection with a germ known as H.Pylori which occurs in 70-90% of cases.

30% cases of stomach ulcers are due to non steroidalanti inflammatory agents (NSAIDS) like aspirin, ibuprofen, diclofenac etc. which are taken as pain killers for arthritis, chronic headache or any other painful condition in the body. Pain killers should always be taken after a meal to prevent peptic ulcer.

Smoking increases the risk of stomach ulcers. Once the ulcer has formed, it is more likely to cause complications and less likely to heal on standard treatment regimens if the patient continues to smoke. Chronic stomach ulcers are usually single.

Patients with peptic ulcer have pain in the abdomen (stomach region), especially after taking food. Some people may have vomiting, but some experience only mild unease and nausea. Some have no symptoms at all, but have anaemia from chronic blood loss from the ulcer, since ulcers can bleed.

Diagnosis can be made by endoscopy, and a biopsy of the ulcer can also be taken at the same time. Double contrast "barium meal" can give added information.

H.Pylori germ is eradicated with suitable antibiotics. Some symptoms get relieved by taking antacids. Surgery is indicated, when the ulcer perforates or there is severe bleeding due to the ulcer or when the ulcer becomes a cancer.


