PASSING THE TORCH

In December 2022, my husband and I had a short holiday in Bangalore with our daughter and family, enjoying every minute of it. One night sleep eluded me and I stood near the bedroom window of the apartment, watching the silent, deserted road, below. The Metro work was going on and a part of the road was cordoned off, with iron rods, bricks and cement bags strewn around. Suddenly I saw a glimmer of bright light flitting around the concrete pillars. It was a fire fly- shining its light in not very congenial surroundings. I watched the little insect darting in and out, glowing in the darkness. How often, I thought, we blame our circumstances for not serving God and for not fulfilling the purposes for which we have been created. The firefly was not in the midst of flowers, plants, or verdant trees, but it was gaily emitting its tiny God-given light! We wallow in the mire of self-pity and sadness, preoccupied with our disappointing circumstances and all the gifts and talents God has blessed us with, lie unused and untapped. In lowly adoration and thanksgiving to our gracious Lord Jesus Christ, we cherish and celebrate the Golden Anniversary of the Riber Memorial Day Care Center (RMDCC) and Community Development Ministry. “Thus far the Lord has helped us” (1 Samuel 7:12).

Twenty-five years ago, I watched a powerful movie *Slumdog Millionaire*. This Oscar-studded film had as its backdrop the stark, and ugly reality of the slums in Mumbai.

There is a remembered day, fifty years ago at the commencement of the morning service at Kirk: with the soaring notes of the organ playing the Prelude and the devout congregation seated in the pews, Reverend Murdoch MacKenzie led a ragged group of children from the neighbouring slums, down the aisle into our stately sanctuary. He brought to the eye what he had preached from the pulpit – the exquisite and everlasting command of Jesus to “Love your neighbour”.

A Ministry was born!

The little preschoolers were received in our Day Care with warmth and care. The wan, timid and ill-clad children were soon transformed into eager little kids, bright eyes filled with curiosity and life.

The children love colours, music, new words, rhymes and creative activity. It is a joy to see them come alive when they enjoy the various playthings provided. They respond eagerly to smiles, laughter and relish tasty snacks and food. They listen, wide-eyed to the stories of Jesus and His love. It is no wonder our Master hit the bull’s eye when He said, “Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven” (Matthew 19:14).

Understanding the close tie between the mother and child, the ministry has programmes to empower the mothers to become economically self-reliant. The Community Development Ministry includes imparting skills like tailoring, producing leather items, phenyl and candle making.

The Ministry is largely supported by our congregation and well-wishers who believe that every child needs a chance under the sun. We trust and pray that the completion of fifty years of ministry in His service will lead us on to invest in higher grasps to reach for this community living on the edge of society.

With no fantasy of a rags-to-riches story, the children need, as children all over the world, compassion and care.

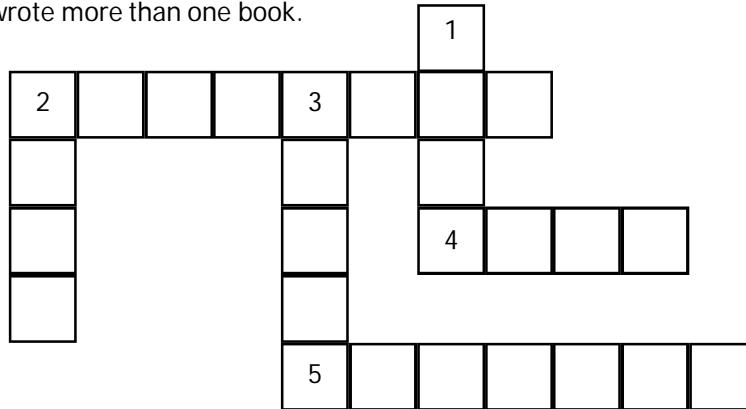

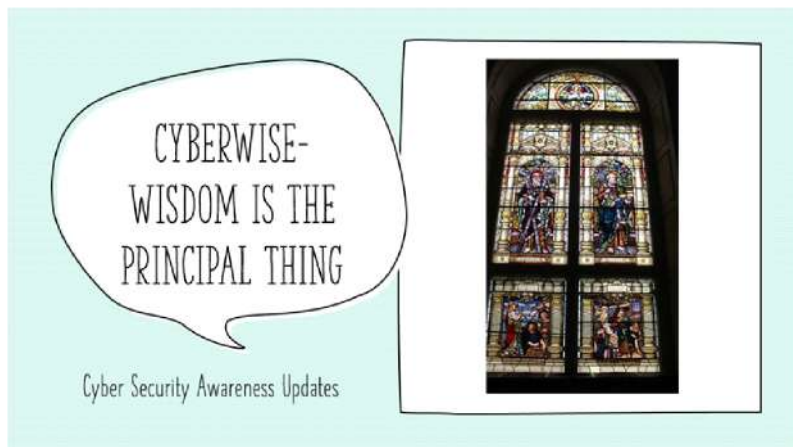

Cyber Security Awareness: Being Cyberwise–2

***The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge,
But fools despise wisdom and instruction.***

Proverbs 1:7



As Christian professionals and believers, we are called to excel in everything we do (2 Corinthians 8:7 ESV). Importantly, when we share our time or resources or knowledge that equip others for good works, we bring glory to God and good to the communities around us. “Whatever you do, do it for the Glory of the Lord” (1 Corinthians 10:31).

In the last update we saw how the ever-increasing incidence of cybercrimes and financial frauds necessitates each and every one of us to be informed, cautious and aware of some of the basics in cyber security. In this context, last month I covered password protection.

In this issue, I would like to share a bit on phishing and leave the social engineering update for next month. Phishing is a type of online fraud that involves attempting to steal sensitive information, such as passwords, bank account credentials and credit card numbers, by posing as a trustworthy entity or individual.

The goal of phishing attacks is to trick you into giving away your personal information, which can then be used for identity theft, financial fraud, or other malicious purposes. Phishing attacks often come in the form of emails, SMS text messages, WhatsApp messages or phone calls that appear to be from a legitimate source, such as a bank, reputed social media sites, a well-known retailer, a close friend or even a family member living far away.

These messages typically contain a sense of urgency, such as a warning of a security breach or a request to update account information. Most commonly used tricks are KYC updates, PAN Number updates, Aadhaar updates or an appeal to help for an emergency and may include a link or attachment that leads to a fake website designed to look like the real thing.

A good percentage of people (8 to 10%) fall to get rich overnight schemes like lottery scams, lucky draws, free giveaways and the like. Remember a golden rule, NOTHING comes free.

To avoid falling victim to phishing scams, it is important to be vigilant and to carefully examine the source of any unsolicited messages before responding. Be wary of unexpected messages. If you receive an email or text message from an entity that you are not familiar with or have a doubt, just delete it. Never click on any links or download any attachments from unknown or doubtful sources.

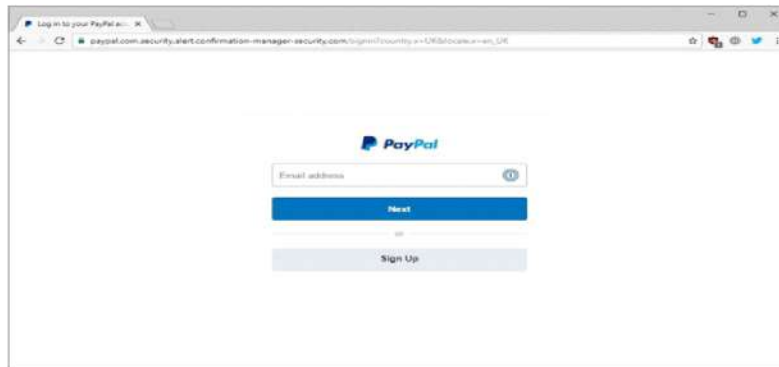
Phishing emails often use fake or misleading email addresses that are designed to look like they are from a legitimate source. Make sure that the email address is accurate before responding. Even if you have the slightest doubt, discard the mail.

Verify the authenticity of websites: Before entering any sensitive information on a website, check that the URL is correct and that the site uses a secure connection (HTTPS).

In order to know what to look for when examining the URL, you need to know how a URL is constructed.



Now, armed with the above knowledge, always make sure that you know what the actual domain you're on is. Sub-domains can be misleading. Here's an example of a first- and second-level sub-domain that intentionally mimic a domain and Top-Level Domain.



This URL is designed to look like it's PayPal.com, but if you take a closer look, you'll notice that those are sub-domains, the name of the actual domain is "confirmation-manager-security."



Remember, the real domain name appears right before the Top-Level Domain (just before ".com/"). So, this is **not** really the PayPal URL. This is a phishing site. Notice how it still displays the little green padlock, thanks to the use of an SSL certificate? That's why you always have to check the URL before accessing or submitting any information.

Remember, if something seems too good to be true, it probably is. Be wary of unsolicited messages, and never give out any personal information without verifying the authenticity of the request. By staying informed and taking these simple precautions, you can help protect yourself and your information assets.

ALLERGIES IN THE BODY – VI

ALLERGIC OCCUPATIONAL LUNG DISEASE - II

“Doctors treat, but Jesus heals”

In certain occupations, the inhalation of dusts, fumes or other noxious substances may give rise to specific pathological changes in the lungs. The risk of these forms of occupational lung disease is highest in spray painters, shipyard and dock workers, miners and quarrymen, welders, electronic assembly workers and those who work in the construction industry or in chemical processing. Prolonged exposure to these allergens (inorganic dusts) lead to destruction of normal lung tissue and scarring (fibrosis) occurs. Industrial gases and fumes can cause acute lung diseases like accumulation of fluid in the lungs (pulmonary oedema) and asthma.

It is very essential to take a detailed occupational history, both present and past, since a diagnosis of occupational lung disease can easily be overlooked, and patient may be eligible for compensation. A long period of dust exposure is required before X-ray (radiological) changes appear. These may be present even before the patient starts clinical symptoms. Lung function tests may reveal decreased lung volumes. For those who are exposed to asbestos, the risk of bronchial cancer is extremely high, especially in patients who also smoke.

The diagnosis is made by careful history taking, x-ray and lung function tests. Biopsy of lung tissue may also be indicated in some patients. Improvements in standard of industrial hygiene are now enforced by law in many countries. Measures such as wearing respirators, damping dust and efficient ventilation systems are already proving effective in a number of industries. The treatment is variable. Each case is assessed carefully, and treatment is given according to the clinical and radiological findings. Respiratory failure is treated appropriately by the lung specialist (pulmonologist).

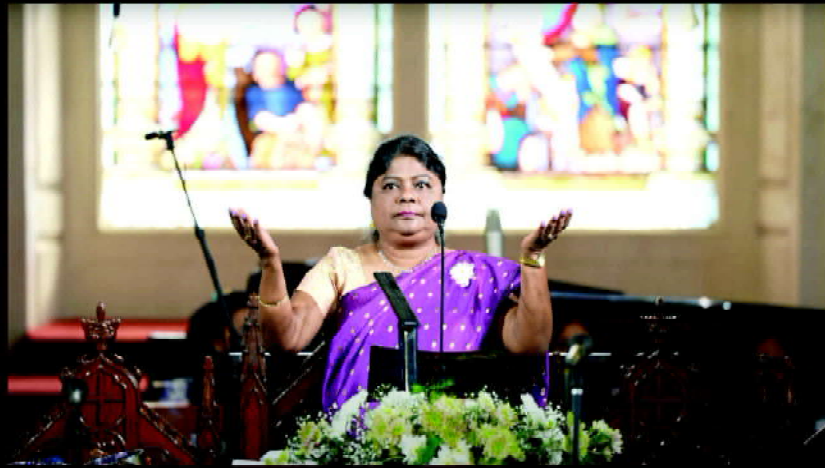
