Why Am I A Christian?



At least once in a while it's good to ask ourselves this question. I guess we've heard these statements from many preachers and pastors time and again but I don't mind repeating them again; We are not Christians just because we've been raised in Christian families. We are not Christians because we bear a 'Christian' name like John, James, Paul, and so on. It is neither because of some tradition that we've been brought up in.

A Christian defines himself (or herself) as a sinner saved by the grace of God through faith in Jesus Christ alone. He (or she) is fully convinced that <u>it is impossible to attain salvation by their own</u> <u>efforts and their only hope and trust is in God's only begotten</u> <u>Son, The Lord Jesus Christ</u>, God's Greatest Gift to mankind, to save them from all their sins. It is the simple act of believing in the virgin birth of Christ, His sinless life on earth, His death on the cross of Calvary for the sins of all mankind (past, present and future), His physical resurrection from the dead three days later, His ascension to Heaven, and His imminent return to judge and rule the world with perfect justice & peace. All of this is <u>not</u> dependent on the person's works. The grace of God that flows through a person who puts his or her faith in Christ is what empowers him/her to live right with God and fulfill His law.

To put it in plain simple terms; this is what it is; There is no way a person can earn favour with God, we must first believe in Christ, his finished work on the cross and his resurrection from the dead. Only after believing this, we can think of doing good works. It is also very important to understand that good works is the <u>result</u> of our salvation, <u>not</u> the cause of it, nor does it add merit to our salvation. Salvation is a free gift from God, which comes only by faith in Jesus Christ. However, good works and righteous living are a vital evidence of saving faith. So the bottom line is this: Even though we can't be saved by works; we can't show that we're saved without works. Faith in Christ alone serves as the solid stable foundation for good works and righteous living. Works must be founded or based on Faith, **NOT** the other way round.

Well, I guess that we've heard these glorious Scriptural truths since our Sunday school days and most (if not all) of us who consider ourselves Christian would claim to believe this. But, we must ask ourselves Do we really believe this in our hearts and confess with our mouths, all what Christ has done for us? for believing is unto righteousness and confession is unto salvation. This is what the Holy Spirit speaking through apostle Paul says in his epistle to the Romans:

"If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." - Romans 10:9-10

Especially for believers in the 21st Century it is very important to examine the content of our faith in order to get a broader perspective of what we believe & why do we believe it. Healing Ministry Report 2013 - 2014

During the last year, the focus of the activities of the Healing Ministry continued to be the clinics at Thirupalaivanam and Karanodai.

The clinic at Thirupalaivanam has been serving the people of the village there for over forty two years, while the clinic at Karanodai was taken over by the Kirk about two years ago. Presently, with the services of the doctors of the Kirk and the help of local doctors engaged to help, we conduct clinics thrice weekly at Thirupalaivanam and twice a week at Karanodai. These include specialty clinics for the treatment of eye problems, skin diseases and diabetes as well as general medical cases. During the last year over sixteen thousand patients were served at Thirupalaivanam and three thousand at Karanodai.

In addition to the clinics on weekdays special camps are conducted on Sundays at regular intervals at these two clinics, providing an opportunity for the doctors of the Kirk to participate in the activities of the Healing Ministry

A well-equipped clinical laboratory was set up in May 2013 at the Thirupalaivanam clinic. Today, we are able to do as many as thirty three clinical pathology and biochemistry lab tests here, which facilitate the doctors in their diagnosis and treatment of the patients attending the clinic. To date over four thousand five hundred tests have been performed benefitting more than four thousand patients. The clinic employs trained lab technicians to do these tests, which are done at highly subsidized charges.

The local staff of the clinic as well as the village project staff conduct awareness programs in the village to educate the population on matters of hygiene, nutrition for children and expectant mothers and the problem of communicable disease.

All patients attending the clinic are provided with a health drink and a plantain. As the clinic begins each day with a message from the evangelist, spiritual nourishment is provided as well.

We are happy to report that through a generous donation, the church has been able to procure a car, Maruti Suzuki Ertiga, for the transport of doctors to the clinics. Even with the employment of a driver, there has been a significant reduction in transport costs, which is a great relief. We are grateful to God's provision in this regard.


In the future our plans are

- 1) Purchase of additional equipment for the lab, to replace old equipment and to improve services.
- 2) Acquiring an ECG machine.
- 3) To start a Dental Clinic once a week (Wednesday)
- 4) Extending medical services to Awrivakkam village.

At present we have ten people working at Thirupalaivanam and four at Karanodai. We are grateful to them for their service.

We thank also Dr.Pitchaimuthu and Dr.Santhalakshmi who conduct the clinics on weekdays and the doctors of the Kirk who run the clinic on Saturdays, some of whom have been attending for decades.

Medical Corner

ALLERGIES IN THE BODY - VIII

ALLERGIC CONTACT ECZEMA

"Doctors treat, but Jesus heals"

Allergic contact eczema is due to a delayed hypersensitivity reaction following contact with antigens (agent leading to allergy). Previous exposure to the allergen is required for sensitisation. The common allergens are nickel, found in cosmetic Jewellery, Jean studs, Clips) dichromate, (found in cement, leather, matches) rubber chemicals (found in clothing, shoes, tyres etc.).

Sticking plaster, hair dye, watch straps, perfumes, citrus fruits skin ointments containing Neomycin, preservatives used in cosmetics and creams can induce contact eczema.

The eczema starts at the site of contact, for example at the wrist due to a watch strap or at the ear lobes due to cosmetic ear rings, and then spreads to other parts of the body. Eczema of the hands and wrist can be due to rubber gloves. Redness, swelling and itching of the skin is a common symptom.

A detailed history is taken and the cause for the eczema is found out. Avoidance of the culprit allergen is the most important treatment for allergic eczema, and may involve lifestyle changes such as a new job or giving up hobbies. Regular use of emollients (skin cream) advised by the skin specialist is also helpful. In severe cases, steroid lotions or ointments may be prescribed by the doctor. The duration of treatment should be strictly according to the doctor's prescription. Self medication is dangerous, and leads to many unnecessary side effects.

Report of the Christian Counseling Ministry 2014

Romans 12:15 says 'Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep'.

Mr. X. is an auto rickshaw driver from Aarakonam. He came to the Egmore Railway station to commit suicide, when he saw our Christian Counseling Ministry sign board on the church compound wall and decided to come to the center. He is originally from the state of Maharashtra but has been living in Tamil Nadu. He is married with two beautiful teenage daughters. He was employed in a factory, but after the factory closed down, he borrowed money from the local financiers to buy an auto. But he could not make ends meet and he could not afford to repay the financiers in time. The financiers threatened him and his family and as he could not see any way out, he thought he would commit suicide.

He came to the center and met the counselor. The counselor counseled him and told him to pray daily and get his strength from the Lord. She encouraged him and motivated him to face his debtors bravely and to save and repay his debts. Today Mr X is a changed man. He has returned to his family and has repaid much of his debts. He called the staff counselor and thanked her profusely.

This is just one of the cases that have been handled by our staff counselor. There are many like Mr. X who have come to the Center completely broken and without hope and have gone back feeling blessed and inspired.

The Christian Counseling Ministry which was started several years ago on Biblical values and principles offers hope and guidance to many who are lonely and broken hearted, and to those who have lost faith in life. We tell all those who come about our Lord and savior Jesus Christ who came to the world to save the broken and the lost. Isaiah 41:10 says "Don't be afraid for I am with you. Don't be discouraged for I am your god. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand". This is the promise of God.

The Christian Counseling Ministry has also organized two workshops between 2013 and 2014. On the 9^{th} June 2013 a workshop on" how to

communicate effectively" was conducted by Aparna and Sanjay Balasundaram from Delhi. This dealt with family dynamics and relationships within the family based on Biblical truths. Parents of young children were invited and while the parents attended the workshop the children were taken care of at the day care center. The workshop was greatly appreciated.

The second workshop was organized by Carol and Joel and the subject was "Family Relationships" This too was very successful and greatly appreciated and we have had several requests from members for more of such workshops.

On the 9th September the staff counselor along with some committee members went to Thirupalaivanam and conducted a full day workshop with the members of the Thirupalaivanam church and others. She spoke on financial management and how to manage their family budget with a power point presentation. The counselor prayed with them and promised to come again soon.

On the 4th January 2014 the staff counselor visited St. Magdalene's School and again with the help of a power point presentation she spoke to the students of the 10,11th and 12th std. She spoke on Stress management and how to study well. 300 students-attended the workshop and the Principal of the school has requested her to come again and have another such workshop. A similar workshop was also held at the Joy Hill School.

The staff counselor also regularly visits The Friend in Need Society, the Friendship Club, The AKCDC, which is a project of our church, the PP home at the YWCA and St. Marks School. She counsels both in Tamil and in English. We are happy to have two eminent Psychiatrists, Dr. Shanti Davidar, who has helped us immensely and lately Dr. Catharine Victoria on our panel at the Christian Counseling Ministry. All problems involving legal matters are referred to the Sahodri at the YWCA

There is complete confidentiality in all cases. The center works from 10 Am to 5 PM and all appointments can be made on the telephone. The staff counselor also attends to 'Walk Ins' who do not have an appointment. All counseling is absolutely free. However there is a 'thank offering box' placed there at the center and anyone who wishes to donate anything towards the church is most welcome to do so.

Canyon of Grandeur

Many of us have had the privilege to come across the splendor of God's creation that has left us in "Awe and Wonder". A visit to the Grand Canyon in Arizona, U.S.A once again brought home the beauty and maiestv of what He has gifted us to observe, preserve and enjoy.

The flight from New York to Las Vegas takes just above six hours. As the aircraft begins its descent into MacCarron International airport in Las Vegas the pilot announces that those sitting on the right side of the aircraft would be able to catch a glimpse of a part of the Grand Canyon. Those on the left, however, would have to make do with catching a glimpse of Lake Mead, the lake created when the Hoover Dam was constructed. The excited reaction of those passengers seated on the right was an indication of what was in store when one finally got to visit this great international tourist spot.

The Grand Canyon is probably the world's most spectacular example of the power of erosion— a chasm 277 miles long and up to 18 miles wide. This erosion has been caused by one of the great river systems in the United States, the Colorado river. The Colorado river begins in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado, flows west through the Grand Canyon, later bends to the south and finally after 1400 miles, empties into the Gulf of California in Mexico. The "West rim", the most popular tourist spot and home to the famous "Skywalk," lies 120 miles East of Las Vegas. The nearly three hour drive from Las Vegas takes you through the arid Arizona landscape dominated by the Joshua Tree — so familiar from the old cowboy movies!

When you finally arrive at the West Rim, the small airport with its small planes and helicopters constantly taking off and landing, the tourist buses and cars arriving and leaving, the presence of other

tourists from all parts of the world etc take up your attention. Then all of a sudden you find yourself at the edge of the canyon, 4000 feet above the mighty Colorado river with a vast scenario of beautifully carved mountains, stretching for miles laid out before you!. That is indeed a breath taking moment! And quite unintentionally the first thought that comes to your mind is that of the Mighty Creator. You find yourself thanking Him for this, His immense work of natural art. Then someone savs that if you ever visit the Grand Canvon you should stay over-night to watch the sun set and the sunrise. Well, who knows? Maybe another day! .

Most of the Grand Canyon tourist areas are located in two native American Indian reservations. Thp Havasupai —"people of the bluegreen waters," occupy a reservation of nearly 185000 acres created by thp Congress in 1975. There are just about 650 of them. The other native Indian tribe is the Hualapani or "People of the tall pines". Today the tribe has roughly 2300 members and occupy a reservation of just less than one million acres created in 1883. Both the tribes control & operate the entire tourist business in the area. In 2007 the Hualapani opened the spectacular horseshoe shaped glass skywalk extending 70 feet out above the canyon Visitors can walk on the solid glass walkway 4000 feet above the canyon floor. An awesome experience indeed! But be warned. The native Indians do not even allow you to use your own cameras on the skywalk. They take the pictures and sell them to you! They also have a model village, the usual antique and gift counters and a cultural programme for visitors.

At the end of the day as you drive back to Las Vegas various thoughts pass through your mind. There are so many rivers in the world, some longer, many wider and definitely so many more flowing with greater force and speed. But none of them have been able to make an impression on mother earth as the Colorado River has done. Over millions of years it has created a mighty work of earthy sculpture along its course to the Gulf of California. It has indeed created a canyon quite matchless in its grandeur, and aptly named, "The Grand Canyon".

In the early days of Russian Communism, One morning in 1927, Rabbi Schneerson was praying in a Leningrad synagogue. Secret police arrested him and ordered him to stop his religious activities. He refused. The interrogator brandished a gun in his face, "This little toy had made many a man change his mind."
